

Zeraus Products Inc. - Essential service operating during COVID-19 pandemic

Based on the updated mandate by the government of Ontario on April 3, we are pleased to inform you that Zeraus Products Inc. remains recognized as an essential service company. The updated list of essential workplaces continues to include manufacturing, such as paint and coatings, as well as retail operations related to maintenance and repair, construction projects and services which support other essential businesses within supply chains, including vehicle and equipment sales, repair and maintenance. These are addressed in the sections noted below extracted from the official list:

Maintenance

Maintenance, repair and property management services strictly necessary to manage and maintain the safety, security, sanitation and essential operation of institutional, commercial, industrial and residential properties and buildings.

Manufacturing

Businesses that manufacture, process and distribute goods, products, and materials, including, chemicals, for the manufacturing and distribution of critically needed construction products and materials to support the maintenance of essential operations in the province of Ontario.

We will continue to manufacture and distribute chemicals, raw materials, cleaners, disinfectant solvents, hand sanitizers and other products that can be utilized in aiding the province in fighting the pandemic.

Construction

We are also engaged in the manufacturing and distribution of critically needed construction products and materials to support the maintenance of essential operations in the province of Ontario. This includes construction projects and services associated with the healthcare sector, water and waste treatment facilities and food processing plants, including repair, expansions, renovations and conversions of spaces that could be repurposed for health care space.

In order to serve our customers safely and effectively, we have adapted the following measures that comply with both provincial and federal government guidelines and mandates, including the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC). These include but are not limited to:

- Prohibiting visitors from entering our warehouse shipping/receiving area without proper protective equipment such as masks, gloves and safety glasses
- Adopting social/physical distancing between employees and/or customers in common areas and office spaces.
- Minimizing business-related travel where necessary and communicating through email and/or phone regarding any assistance and support that you may require.

- Restricting access to production facilities to only critical operational staff.
- Establishing new protocols for pick-up and deliveries of products in our warehouse (more details to follow soon).
- Maintaining a continuous stock of hand sanitizing products and other sanitary supplies in our offices and warehouse.
- Increasing the frequency of the cleaning of hard surfaces that are frequently touched such as door handles, light switches and taps.
